EPISTLE: Acts 2:1-24 (KJV) PENTECOST -- In the Old Testament, 50 days were counted from the Sabbath of Passover Feast (March/April) to the end of grain harvest (May/June). On that 50th day, offerings of the Firstfruits of the grain harvest were presented at the temple. This festival was called Shavuoth, in Hebrew, meaning "fiftieth." When Greek became spoken, the same festival was called Pentecost, also meaning "fiftieth." --- Consider, Jesus was crucified on Friday of Passover week, and rose from the grave on the Sunday of Passover week, at which time the 50 day count for Firstfruits began. On the 40th day, before ascending into heaven, Jesus promised He would send the Holy Spirit to His disciples. Ten days later, on the 50th Day—the Firsfruits Festival, or Pentecost—He poured out the promised Holy Spirit upon the apostles. With boldness, conviction, and the ability to speak languages they had never studied, the apostles proclaimed Jesus of Nazareth as the crucified and risen Savior from sin, to all those in Jerusalem for the Feast. 3000 were baptized and added to the Believers that day! This first Christian Pentecost marked the beginning of the New Testament Church. ---- May the Lord continue to send the Holy Spirit to His church today, so that we clearly and boldly proclaim salvation in Jesus!

GOSPEL John 14:23-27 On the night of His betrayal, Jesus spoke earnestly with the disciples. He told them that He was going to the Father. He told them that the Father would send the Counselor, the Holy Spirit of Truth, to teach them all things. The Holy Spirit would point them to Christ and would give them peace. May the Holy Spirit continue to give us peace in Christ as well.

THE THIRD ARTICLE OF THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in the Holy Ghost; the Holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him.

The Philippines (SE Asia) – Pastor Rob Sauers (Bd of Missions) and Missionary Ohlmann spent a week in the Philippines with Pastor Jordan Palangyos and those he serves. Discussions involved the ministry of the Lutheran Autonomous Mission of the Philippines (LAMP). Informational meetings were also held with several church leaders and evangelists. Pastor Palangyos is an independent Lutheran pastor who serves two congregations and a few preaching stations in the mountains north of Manila. He has been working independently since 2008 when he followed God's Word and withdrew from the Lutheran Church of the Philippines. He has completed the first of the CLC Online Theological Studies based on the CLC Statement of Faith and Purpose. He regularly corresponds with Missionary Ohlmann. Official colloquy proceedings will begin upon Pres. Wilke appointing a CLC representative to work with Missionary Ohlmann. Pray that the colloquy process finds a God-pleasing unity of faith and teaching. Ask the Lord to provide opportunities and all that is necessary for Pastor Jordan to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ!

Tanzania and Missionary Naumann (East Africa) – Missionary Naumann recently reported that the first four weeks of classes at the Wittenberg Lutheran

Theological Seminary in Arusha have gone well. He is impressed with the dedication of the seven students and their sincere desire to study and learn God's Word. He has been active in the ministry at the local congregation. He has started a Sunday School program for the children of the congregation. See the blog at: clc-tz.blogspot.com seminary/evangelism course. Ask for the Lord's blessings on these students and those called to teach and train them.

Kenya (East Africa) – The CLC Bd of Missions recently began sending MDF Grant funds to assist with much-needed classroom repairs and construction at the Kinship-supported schools in Etago and Moi's Bridge. Construction is progressing quickly. Give thanks to the Lord for the privilege of assisting our brothers and sisters in Christ in training young souls in these two schools. Pray for the Lord's blessings upon teachers, students, and staffs of St. David's Kinship School and Emmaus Millimani School.

Togo and Missionary Evensen (West Africa) – Missionary Evensen will return to the U.S. in June for furlough and the CLC General Pastoral Conference. **Pray that the Lord** will grant him safe and uneventful travels, and **pray for God's blessings** on the time of fellowship and growth during the conference.

Bangladesh (SE Asia) – Missionary Ohlmann was able to share the Gospel at eleven Bangladesh Lutheran Church Mission (BLCM) congregations and preaching stations. He conducted a four-day pastor and church leader training seminar for sixteen BLCM pastors and church leaders. Thank the Lord as pastors and evangelists are being trained in the truth of God's saving Word and as many are being led from Hinduism and Islam to saving faith in Jesus. Ask the Lord to bless the BLCM and its plans to construct a building.

CLC Mission Helper Trip to Nepal (SE Asia) – The 2023 CLC Mission Helpers traveling to Nepal depart on June 26th. This trip will provide eleven CLC volunteers and two trip leaders the opportunity and privilege of proclaiming God's saving word to an estimated 1500 children. Some of these children will be members of the Himalayan Church of the Lutheran Confession (HCLCN), but most are not. For many, this will be the first time they have heard a clear and Biblical presentation of the Good News of Jesus Christ, who died and rose from the dead for their sins! Please pray that the Lord would give love, compassion, patience, wisdom, and safety to the Mission Helpers and to the children they go to serve.
