SERMON: MARK 16:1-8

RUNNING AT EASTER

[Saturday evening] Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. [Sunday Morning] Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large.

And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples—and Peter—that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you."

So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

I CORINTHIANS 15:17-26, 55-57

THE RESURRECTION: The full truth of what Christ accomplished on the cross on Good Friday is brought home with stunning reality on Easter Sunday morning!

He lives again!

The penalty for the world's sins and yours has been paid in full.

The Father does not look with anger upon those clinging to Christ by faith.

You are forgiven

You are safe.

Hell cannot claim you; the grave cannot hold you.

You shall physically rise from death and the grave.

You shall live forever in heaven!

You are saved!

EASTER SUNDAY: Some Christians maintain that the word "Easter" comes from the name of the ancient Germanic goddess *Oster*, goddess of the dawn or east ("Ost" in German still means east). Oster's festival was observed every spring. The conjecture is that the early German Christians kept the name of the pagan festival when observing the Resurrection of Jesus--*Oster Fest* The name "Easter," then, is considered a derogatory name for Christ's Resurrection. --- On the other hand, if God has bent the name of a false deity and made it the label for the victory of the Savior over Satan, how amazing!

Interestingly Martin Luther, in his German New Testament, translated the word "Passover" as "Oster"—our English word Easter. We do not know why he called Passover "Oster." Perhaps it was that on the night of the first Passover, the Israelites received their freedom from Egypt's slavery and entered the dawn, the "east," the new day, of freedom. They were headed to the Promised Land! "Dawn," "New Day" "East Festival" is exactly what Jesus' Resurrection is! He rose from the grave of sin and death and entered into the "dawn," the "new day" of glory. His rising means the same for us. Through Him we have a new spiritual life already now; we are forgiven! On the last day we shall rise to the new physical life for Heaven! Indeed, a New Day, a Dawn Day, an East-er!
