EPISTLE: I Corinthians 8:1-12 Although one may have a "right," even before God, to do something; it may not always be helpful to do it. If your "right" action, leads someone else astray, then they and you have sinned. You have not acted in love. Paul speaks of eating meat offered at an idol's temple. While an idol is actually nothing, fellow Christians who do not yet understand, may think it's ok to worship God and a false god at the same time. Sin for both. One cannot always use "rights." Be concerned for the other.

GOSPEL: Luke 7:11-17 When Jesus was entering the city of Nain, He met a burial procession going out. The dead was the only son of his mother, a widow. She was truly alone. She wept. In His compassion, Jesus encouraged her not to weep. In His love and power, Jesus restored the young man to life! ---When days are dark, Jesus your Savior, is at hand.
