EPISTLE: Galatians 6:1-10 Conceit is not a virtue from God. Condemning others out of self-righteousness is not pleasing to God. Rather, gently correct those who go astray, remembering your own weak flesh. Share good things with God's servants whom He has sent to teach salvation in Jesus. Living for self and the flesh brings its own sad end. Christian humility leads us to treat members of the household of faith—fellow believers—with kindness, mercy, and love in Christ.

GOSPEL Matthew 6:24-34 To be worried and frantic for earthly things does not mesh with living for God. Physical concerns or spiritual concerns will take first place in the heart. The things of this world—money, food, drink, clothing, life itself—are only short-term items. Forgiveness and rescue from sin by God in His Son Jesus lasts forever! SERMON: GENESIS 4:1-15 ANGER AND PRIDE WHEN THINGS DON'T SIT WELL

¹Now Adam knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, and said, "I have acquired a man from the LORD." ² Then she bore again, this time his brother Abel. Now Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground. ³ And ¹ in the process of time it came to pass that Cain brought an offering of the fruit of the ground to the LORD. ⁴ Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat. And the LORD respected Abel and his offering, ⁵ but He did not respect Cain and his offering. And Cain was very angry, and his countenance fell.

REPORT FROM SPECIAL MEETINGS RE: KETTERLING BEQUEST:

9-14-25 (9 voters, 3 visitors, + pastor): There was a general discussion on various needs for these funds, and on various ways to invest a large portion of these funds. Another meeting will be held on 9-21, when more info. will be available.

9-21-25 (8 voters + pastor.) The Ketterling bequest (\$235,000) was deposited into a savings account. An additional (smaller) check will also be forthcoming. Voters decided that 10% (\$23,500) of the first check will be given to mission outreach--half to the synod's MDF (Mission Development Fund) and half to be used for our own local outreach. This transaction will take place when the second check arrives. Remaining funds will be invested into higher-bearing accounts through Harlan Stephans of Pioneer in Belle Fourche (George Ketterling's advisor), or through investment individuals locally. Annual income will be available for congregation needs, community needs, etc. The principle will remain untouched for the foreseeable future. If there are any members who have thoughts or ideas on these matters, please speak with Dwight Wenner or Clayton Pederson. We praise the Lord for this most generous gift and ask that He would lead us to use it wisely.
