Hymn 11 Safely through Another Week

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 1:1-9. Through His Word, God has blessed us with His grace in Christ (undeserved love and pardon). We eagerly wait for Jesus' return, and on that Last Day we will be found blameless! God, who has called us to faith, is faithful and will keep us safe in Christ.

GOSPEL Matthew 22:34-46. Jesus' enemies with their shallow wisdom tried to trap Jesus in His words. They asked Him which commandment was the greatest. Jesus promptly answered: "Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, and mind." Then Jesus asked them a question: "Whose son will the Messiah be?" They answered "the son of David." Jesus, however, pointed them to an Old Testament passage which states that the Messiah would be David's Lord! The enemies would not comment or respond. If that were the case, then Jesus of Nazareth would fit the description perfectly—which they did not want to state. They were not so wise.

SERMON: II Corinthians 4:1-10 GLORY! AND NO GLORY

GLORY:

Therefore, since we have this ministry as we have received mercy, we do not lose heart. But we have renounced the hidden things of shame, not walking in craftiness nor handling the Word of God deceitfully, but by manifestation of the truth, commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God.

But even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, whose minds the god of this age has blinded, who do not believe, lest the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine on them.
