QUESTIONING OF CONFIRMANDS Justin Schopp Miles Wiechmann

Having learned the chief teachings of the Christian faith from their study of the Bible, using Luther's Small Catechism as a guide, our confirmands today are publicly "examined." This examination is not a final test. It is an opportunity for them to show that they have studied Scripture, speak publicly of their faith, and review for the congregation the truths which the congregation also learned.

SERMON: Revelation 2:8b-10 THE FIRST, THE LAST, AND THE CROWN!

These things says the First and the Last, who was dead, and came to life: I know your works, tribulation, and poverty (but you are rich); and I know the blasphemy of those who say they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. Do not fear any of those things which you are about to suffer. Indeed, the devil is about to throw some of you into prison, that you may be tested, and you will have tribulation ten days. Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life!"

THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

The rite of confirmation is not a Biblical command. There is no Bible verse that says, "Thou shalt be confirmed." However, the Bible is very clear that **instruction**, for young and old alike, is necessary. Therefore . . .

Confirmation is that practice in the Christian Church by which the confirmands

- 1) are instructed in the teachings of Holy Scripture;
- 2) publicly declare their faith in the Triune God and in Christ their Savior,
- 3) pledge faithfulness to the Lord in whose Name they were baptized. The rite of Confirmation is also that practice by which the *congregation*
 - 1) receives the confirmands' statement of faith in Christ the Savior,
 - 2) pronounces the Lord's blessings upon the confirmands,
 - 3) receives them into adult membership and the Lord's Table

THE LORD'S SUPPER:

VISITORS, please note that St. Luke's does not practice "open" communion. Communion is an expression of oneness with the Lord, but is also an expression of unity with one another. Differences of teaching (doctrine) do separate Christian from Christian on this earth. We ask that only members of St. Luke's or sister CLC congregations come forward.

Be assured that we are not judging anyone's heart or faith in Jesus. God alone can see the heart. For further questions, please speak to the pastor. Thank you.

Preparation for Holy Communion:

Dear people of God: For those intending to come to the Lord's Table, it is fitting that you diligently examine your hearts as St. Paul exhorts (I Corinthians 11:27-29), lest you receive the Lord's Supper in an unworthy manner—making a mockery of it and of the Savior's redemption of your soul—bringing judgment rather than blessing upon yourselves.

Therefore, I ask you before God:

- **1.** Do you confess that you are a sinner before God and deserve His wrath and punishment? --- Then declare so by saying: I do confess.
- **2.** Do you humbly seek the Lord's forgiveness, believing that Jesus is your Savior from sin, and that God, by grace, for Jesus' sake, forgives you all your sins? --- Then declare so by saying: I do believe.

Your Father in heaven, looks upon you with mercy for Jesus' sake. His Son was wounded for your transgressions and bruised for your iniquities. God made Him, who knew no sin, to be sin for us; so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God. Comfort your heart. In Jesus, you are forgiven.

- **3.** Do you in humble faith recognize that the body and blood of the Lord Jesus are truly present together with the bread and the wine in this blessed sacrament? --- Then declare so by saying: I do so recognize.
- **4.** As a forgiven child of God, do you intend, with the assistance of God the Holy Spirit, to amend your sinful life and to put away the sin that so easily entangles? --- Then declare so by saying: I do so intend.

Receive this Sacrament with joy, comfort, and peace.
