HOLY COMMUNION

How often should one go to the Lord's Supper? The Bible does not say. However, there are two related matters. 1) Beware not to despise God's precious gift of the Lord's Supper, to scoff at the Savior's personal assurance of forgiveness. Do not carelessly calculate that one's absence from Holy Communion is no big deal--no harm done. Christ Himself said, "Do this in remembrance of Me." !! Receive His redeeming body and blood, present miraculously with the bread and the wine. Receive it to strengthen your bond to 2) But isn't it possible to receive the sacrament too often? In humble faith, one cannot go to the sacrament too often.

EPISTLE: Romans 15:4-7 SUMMARIZED. Paul encourages that we carry-on patiently in this life, maintaining oneness with others in Christ. Christ Himself came for Jew and Gentile alike—outwardly two very different groups! Both Jew and Gentile are included in God's kingdom of salvation. Likewise let us patiently receive one another, being of one mind with one another—no matter how different we may be outwardly Let us maintain oneness in the Kingdom of God, as rooted in His Word of Truth.

GOSPEL: Luke 21:25-36 SUMMARIZED. In preparing our hearts for Christmas, we rightly prepare for Christ's return at the End. Fear of events in this unraveling world need not alarm us. Dread of standing before the holy Lord, need not paralyze us. The dear Savior comes! All is well! Our focus is not on earthly things, but on our Lord and Savior. Put away the distractions of the flesh and of the world. On Christmas Day, and on the Last Day, we hold our heads high in joy! Christ, our Redeemer has come! Rejoice!

Worship is upstairs this year. **CHILDREN'S REHEARSALS:** Today after service the children will have time to eat a sack lunch and then the rehearsal for Christmas Eve. THE ADVENT WREATH: The Advent wreath is a Christian custom used in preparation for Christmas. It's origins appear to be from Lutheran circles in Germany during the 1800's. Originally a candle was lit each day in Advent to point children ahead to the great day of Christmas. Modifications have been made. We now have one candle for each week and one candle for Christmas. Various meanings and points of devotion exist regarding each of the candles. THE 1ST ADVENT CANDLE (VIOLET—the color of repentance): The "Prophecy Candle" begins the period of waiting. It reminds us of the Old Testament promises/prophecies of the coming of the Savior from sin. With humble hearts of repentance awaiting the Savior from sin, we think back to the many believers before us who waited patiently and longingly for the promise of the coming Savior to be fulfilled.

THE 2ND ADVENT CANDLE (VIOLET—the color of repentance): The "Bethelehm Candle" reminds us that the eternal Son of God humbly came to this earth to be born of a woman at Bethlehem—true God and true man, our Savior!
