The Devil Defeated

As we hear this familiar Bible account, we might have the impression that Jesus was in the wilderness for forty days and then experienced three temptations, perhaps over the course of an hour. Luke's account, however, tells us that Jesus was "tempted for forty days by the devil." Since Jesus is true Man, surely He experienced temptation daily, as do we. But this forty day period seems to be a time of intensified assault by the devil, the likes of which we cannot imagine.

Throughout this barrage, Jesus remained unscathed. He weathered every temptation. Ultimately, the devil had to leave, defeated. Armed with the Word of God, Jesus was able to deflect every dart that Satan threw His way.

In doing so, He gave us a model to follow, a blueprint for defeating the devil. Jesus consistently applied the Word of God in His desert-defeat of Satan. And that is our only hope of resisting the devil. No amount of willpower on our part will suffice. Our full reliance upon God and His divine Word is our only hope.

Yet, even though we are provided with the tools to resist Satan's assaults, we will continue to fail. Fully fed, fully rested, and in all modern comforts--advantages which our Savior did not have in the desert--we will still stumble under Satan's prompts.

Thanks be to God that Jesus' successful work in the desert is credited to us. as our victory over Satan! Jesus completed the task of perfect obedience in our place. So now, when we stumble, we can look to the cross and see all of our sins fully paid for by our triumphant, heroic Savior! Praise be to Jesus for His valiant work in the desert, and throughout His life and His sacrificial death and resurrection on our behalf!

Dear Jesus, when we think of all that You endured in our place, we marvel at what You did for us. Thank You for taking our place and fulfilling God's commands for us. Thank You for taking on the punishment that we have earned. Thank You for defeating our enemy the devil. Amen
