--Matthew 17:5

HOLY COMMUNION

How does the pastor get the authority to administer the very special sacrament of Holy Communion? Does he receive authority directly from God? No, God does not speak to the pastor directly Does he receive it by virtue of graduation from a seminary? No, seminary classes are only training, Does he receive it from the pastor who ordained or not authorization. installed him, who in turn received it from the pastor who ordained and installed him—all the way back to the apostles and Jesus? No, the Bible speaks of no passing on of the office of the ministry from one pastor to another. then? Scripture does teach that the pastor's authority to administer Holy Communion, or to baptize, or to teach the Word is given to him by the members of the congregation. Christ has granted to believers the universal priesthood in which they have direct access to God through Jesus and are authorized to proclaim the name of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light (I Peter 2:9). The believers, the congregation, under the Lord's guidance, asks or CALLS a man to do this FOR them. The pastor's "authority" is from the congregation. Authority in the Christian church is at the bottom, not the top.

GOSPEL: Matthew 17:1-9 At the Transfiguration of Jesus, Jesus was briefly displayed in His divine glory as witnessed by Peter, James and John. In all brilliance and majesty, Jesus spoke with the Old Testament prophets Moses and Elijah concerning His imminent death and departure. God the Father spoke words of approval from heaven, "This is My beloved Son." It was evident that Jesus of Nazareth was the special Son and Servant of God to rescue sinners. ---- Don't ignore Him!

EPISTLE: II Peter 1:16-21 Peter wrote about Jesus' "majesty," which he himself witnessed. Peter had been on the mountain of Transfiguration. He saw the glory and head the Father speak. Jesus was the Son of God! The Old Testament prophets likewise bore witness that the promised One, the Savior, would be true God. ---- Heed both of these great witnesses!

SERMON: II Kings 17:6-23 (selected verses)

BECAUSE OF THE PARTING OF THE WAYS, JESUS WAS TRANSFIGURED

- 6-7) In the ninth year of Hoshea [king of Israel], the king of Assyria took Samaria and carried Israel away to Assyria.... For so it was that the children of Israel had sinned against the LORD their God, who had brought them up out of the land of Egypt from under the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt, and they had feared other gods.
- 16-18) They left all the commandments of the LORD their God, made for themselves a molded image and two calves, made a wooden image and worshiped all the host of heaven, and served Baal. And they caused their sons and daughters to pass through the fire, practiced witchcraft and soothsaying and sold themselves to do evil in the sight of the LORD to provoke Him to anger. Therefore, the LORD was very angry with Israel, and removed them from His sight. There was none left but the tribe of Judah alone.
- 22-23) The children of Israel [had] walked in all the sins of Jeroboam which he did. They did not depart from them until the LORD removed Israel out of His sight, as He had said by all His servants the prophets. So Israel was carried away from their own land to Assyria, as it is to this day.
