EPISTLE: I Corinthians 13 1-13 New Testament Greek has three different words for love—1) *philia*, natural love, within a family; 2) *eros*, intimate love; 3) *agape* (pronounced ah-gah-pay), a love that sacrifices self without any obligation to do so. A-ga-pe love is the love described in our reading. It is the love that the Lord has for sinners and that Christians are directed to have toward one another. To love others without Christ's a-ga-pe love in our hearts is valueless before God.

PSALM 8, p. 27 "O Lord, How Excellent Is Your Name in All the Earth!"

GOSPEL: Luke 18:31-43 Jesus said to His disciples, "Behold, we go up to Jerusalem." Jesus knew this trip to Jerusalem would bring His suffering, death, and resurrection, all for the salvation of sinners! The disciples did not grasp it. On the way, Jesus compassionately healed a blind man. The blind man, in simple faith, did grasp that Jesus was the Promised Savior! ---- This week we enter the Lenten season. During the six weeks ahead, we also "go up to Jerusalem" with our Savior. We review the precious events and Truths of Christ's Passion. Through personal Bible readings and joint worship, we ponder, though inadequately, our Savior's sacrifice to rescue us from our sins. May He open our spiritual eyes, blinded by sin, to see His love, forgiveness, and salvation!

SERMON: Romans 10:1-11 ZEAL APART FROM CHRIST-MISDIRECTED ZEAL

Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. For I bear them witness that they have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

For Moses writes about the righteousness which is of the law, "The man who does those things shall live by them."

But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven' (that is, to bring Christ down from above) or 'Who will descend into the abyss' (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead)?

But what does it say? "The Word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

THE -GESIMA SUNDAYS: SEPTUAGESIMA, SEXAGESIMA, QUINQUAGESIMA. These unusual names for Sundays are passed down to us from the church of the Middle Ages. They are Latin names for the Sundays on the traditional church calendar that fall between Transfiguration Sunday (last Sunday of Epiphany season) and the beginning of Lent. The words mean 70th, 60th, and 50th, respectively; and the Sundays fall approximately 70, 60, and 50 days before Easter. The names are similar to our English words septuplets, sextuplets, and quintuplets. This year we celebrate only one of the three Gesima Sundays—Quinquagesima.
