### THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

The unleavened bread which we use in Holy Communion is used in the form of small individual wafers. However, we know from Scripture that Jesus broke off portions from a loaf and did not use wafers. *Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying . . . (Matthew 26:26).* We do not know just how the unleavened loaf looked (flat?), nor its actual size. We today certainly could use an unleavened loaf, breaking off portions for each communicant. In fact the concept of unity would be better pictured! However, the use of individual wafers is convenient. It is also of long standing usage in the Christian church, likely going back to 1100-1200 AD.

EPISTLE: Ephesians 5:1-8 SUMMARY: Be imitators of God! Among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality! You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord! Live as children of light!

GOSPEL: Luke 11:14-23 SUMMARY: Jesus had just driven a demon out of a man His enemies maintained that He had done so by the power of Beelzebub (Satan). Jesus pointed out that a kingdom which attacks itself does not stand. Only when someone is stronger than a strong man, can the strong man be subdued. Jesus had just subdued a demon; He is stronger than Satan! He is God! Anyone who opposes Jesus actually opposes God. Beware.

### SERMON: John 10:22-39

### NOT INTIMIDATED

Now it was the Feast of Dedication in Jerusalem, and it was winter. And Jesus walked in the temple, in Solomon's porch. Then the Jews surrounded Him and said to Him, "How long do You keep us in doubt? If You are the Christ, tell us plainly."

Jesus answered them, I told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in My Father's name, they bear witness of Me. But you do not believe, because you are not of My sheep, as I said to you.

My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand. My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of My Father's hand. I and My Father are one.

Then the Jews took up stones again to stone Him. Jesus answered them, Many good works I have shown you from My Father—for which of those works do you stone Me?

The Jews answered Him, saying, For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy, and because You, being a Man, make Yourself God.

Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, "I [God] said, You are gods"? If He called them gods, to whom the word of God came (and the Scripture cannot be broken), do you say of Him whom the Father sanctified and sent into the world, "You are blaspheming!" because I said, I am the Son of God? If I do not do the works of My Father, do not believe Me. But if I do, though you do not believe Me, believe the works, that you may know and believe that the Father is in Me, and I in Him.

Therefore, they sought again to seize Him, but He escaped out of their hand.
