THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

To those who commune: The Lord's Supper is not child's play. It is a devout reception of the very price of our eternal salvation—Christ's true body and blood miraculously given to us in, with, and under the bread and the wine. We do well to approach the Lord's Table with forethought. It is not wise to come forward simply on a whim or in shallow haste—"Oh! Is it Communion today? Great! I haven't gone for a while. I'll go right up!"—and give it no more thought than that. Take time to examine your heart: Do you acknowledge your sin and your sinfulness? Do you look to Christ for forgiveness and peace? Do you recognize that His body and blood are in this sacrament for you? Then come to the Lord's altar in humble faith. Depart from His table in joyful thanks. With God's strength, amend your sinful life.

EPISTLE: I John 4:15-21 God's love for us in Christ instills love and trust in our hearts for God. His love for us in Christ gives our hearts confidence to stand before Him without fear. Perfect love casts out fear. God is love, and His love is demonstrated in the sacrifice of His Son. If anyone claims that he loves God, but is filled with hatred toward his brother; he is a liar.

GOSPEL Luke 16:19-31 In Jesus' story / parable of the Rich Man and Poor Lazarus, the rich man did not love and trust in God; nor did he love the beggar Lazarus. When he was in hell and Lazarus in heaven, the rich man was reminded that his physical "status" on earth did not make him a true "child of Abraham." Simple trust in God's promise of mercy and forgiveness in Christ—such as Lazarus had in his lowly life—makes one a true child of Abraham. Too late, the rich man learned that the days given on earth are the ONE time of grace to cling by faith to Christ and to live for Him. The rich man also learned too late that the Scriptures are the ONE source for knowing this salvation.
