HOLY COMMUNION

The Sacrament of Holy Communion is also known as "The Lord's Supper," a most appropriate name. Christ and His disciples were celebrating the Passover Supper. It was His last meal with them before His betrayal and death.. That meal has been called the Last Supper. (Da Vinci's famous painting). During the Passover Meal, or Last Supper, Jesus instituted a new and special eating and drinking. Using the unleavened bread and the grape wine of the Passover Meal, He shared with His disciples His true body and blood for their personal assurance of redemption from sin, death, and hell. He instructed them to celebrate it often. We still do. This special eating and drinking is called Holy Communion, the Sacrament of the Altar, and the Lord's Supper.

On page 17: The Kyrie will be read by the Pastor In place of the Gloria in Excelsis, the congregation will sing Hymn 16 vy. 1 & 4, "Blessed Jesus, at Thy Word"

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 1:1-9. Through His Word, God has blessed us with His grace (undeserved love and pardon) in Christ. We, now, eagerly await Jesus' return on that Last Day, when we will be found blameless! God, who has called us to faith, is faithful. He will keep us safe in Christ.

GOSPEL Matthew 22:34-46. Jesus' enemies with their shallow wisdom tried to trap Jesus in His words. They asked Him which commandment was the greatest. Jesus answered: "Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, and mind." Jesus asked *them* a question: "Whose son is the Messiah?" They promptly answered "the son of David." Jesus, however, pointed them to an Old Testament passage which states that the Messiah would be David's Lord!

The enemies did not respond. They did not want to admit that the Promised Messiah would be in fact *both* Son of God *and* son of man. That description fit Jesus and His miraculous power perfectly---which they did not want to acknowledge. They were not so wise.

SERMON: Luke 7:36-50 HOW MUCH DO YOU LOVE THE LORD? WHY?

Then one of the Pharisees asked Him to eat with him. And He went to the Pharisee's house, and sat down to eat. And behold, a woman in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, and stood at His feet behind Him weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil.

Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he spoke to himself, saying, "This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner."

And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." So he said, "Teacher, say it." "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?" Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more." And He said to him, "You have rightly judged."

Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. You did not anoint My head with [olive] oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little."

Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." And those who sat at the table with Him began to say to themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" Then He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."
