Historians use 10/31 1517 to mark the beginning of the Reformation.

SUMMARY OF CLC COORDINATING COUNCIL, Fall 2021

President (Pastor Michael Eichstadt)

We thank the Lord for being able to hold the postponed 2020 Convention. Much was accomplished. -- The 2022 Convention is set for June 23-26, 2022. -- Pastor Sam Rodebaugh has accepted the appointment as recruiter for the public ministry.

Board of Doctrine (Pastor Emeritus David Schierenbeck, chairman)

God's love for sinners in Christ Jesus is the center of Christian faith and life. From His love, flows His children's "walking in truth" (2 John 1:4) and "walking in love according to His commandments" (2 John 1:6). -- The Board together with our three-man Committee meeting with WELS/ELS has begun a document that clearly and concisely identifies what Scripture teaches regarding admonition and termination of fellowship, including the rejection of false teaching. We are formulating the requirements expected of the WELS/ELS in order to re-establish fellowship. -- The Board has revised our Colloquy procedure.

Board of Education, and Board of Publications (Pastor David Naumann, chairman)

We are working to have all CLC Boards adapt their websites so as to have common CLC look and feel. -- We have met with the Board of Missions to discuss developing and implementing a Christian Day School program for home mission congregations as an outreach tool. -- We continue updating current online Sunday School lessons for God's Hand in Our Lives, and adding new lessons. Teaching videos have been submitted by volunteers, which will lead to virtual Sunday School classes for every lesson and level. -- Work has begun on publishing David Lau's Church History, an 80-chapter work, on one of the CLC websites in PDF format.

Board of Missions (Mr. Joel Krafft, chairman)

Living Hope, Appleton, WI, is investigating a new church building. Gift of God, (Mapleton, ND, will become a self-supporting congregation in January. --The Board together with the Board of Education and Publications has begun investigating starting Christian Day Schools in mission subsidized congregations as an outreach tool. -- The Committee on Domestic Fields is preparing a "Mission Myths" simulcast for Saturday, November 13th. This presentation can be joined by individuals or congregations and could be used as a Mission Festival event. More information will be made available soon. -- Missionary Todd Ohlmann was forced to cancel or postpone most of his scheduled trips over the past six months due to pandemic-related issues. Missionary Peter Evensen continues his work as resident missionary in Togo. Retired Teacher Ted Quade is serving as Supervisor of Instructors in Foreign Missions Christian Schools. He will be scheduling an initial visit to the schools in Mois' Bridge and Etago. – The BELC in India has requested help in establishing yet another district. -- A Mission Helper Trip to East Africa is being planned for next summer. -- Project Kinship's efforts are currently focused on providing COVID and medical assistance in our foreign fields with the continued support of sponsors and congregational offerings. Kinship continues to recruit sponsors for orphans and seminary students with the goal of having a waiting list of sponsors ready for future needs.

Immanuel Lutheran College Board of Regents (Pastor John Hein, chairman)

Enrollment: 122 students.51 residents in the dormitories. -- New Staff: Professor David Schaller, music. Marcy Gurgel, high school art instructor. Paul Agenten, boys' dorm supervisor. Courntey Agenten, girls' dorm supervisor. Student Resident Assistant as a night monitor in the boys' dorm so that there is constant supervision in both dorms at all times. April Sydow, female mentor for high school students. We pray that the LORD will provide the new servants with wisdom and guidance as they serve. -- This school year we have returned almost entirely back to normal and are back in our regular classrooms. Face masks are optional at school. -- The Limited Ministry Program, for experienced laymen who have a desire to be of greater assistance in the church, is being newly promoted. -- A new pamphlet on CLC Teacher Certification will be sent out to CLC day schools and principals. -- A hailstorm damaged professorages and other campus buildings. Insurance payment of \$34,500 was received for the professorages. We await resolution on the other campus buildings. -- Both tuition and room & board rates will increase for FY 2023. The goal is to limit the increase of out-of-pocket student tuition cost by no more than \$100/year.

Board of Trustees (Mr. Tom Lentz, chairman)

The Year-to-Date General Fund balance is -\$52,922, which is a \$20,000 greater deficit than the previous fiscal year. The Church Extension Fund (CEF) has approved a loan to Messiah, Eau Claire. Promissory notes to the CEF will be renewed at 2% unless request is made for payment. New promissory notes are not currently being accepted.
