THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

From Martin Luther, 1529

What can a person do if he is not aware of his burden of sin and does not feel hunger and thirst [feels no need] for Holy Communion?

(PART 1 Previous bulletin: Do he still have **flesh and blood?** By all means he ought believe what the Scriptures say about it: *Romans* 7:18 *Galatians* 5:17, 19-21).

PART 2: Secondly, that he look around to see whether he is still **in the world** and keep in mind that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say:

John 15:18-20 If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. Remember the word that I said to you: A servant is not greater than his master. If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you.

Matthew 24:9-13 They will deliver you up to tribulation and kill you, and you will be hated by all nations for My names' sake. And then many will be offended, will betray one another, and will hate one another. Then many false prophets will rise up and deceive many. And because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold. But he who endures to the end shall be saved.

Acts 14:22 We must through much tribulation enter the kingdom of God.

GOSPEL: Luke 8:4-15 The Parable of the Sower and the Seed. When the Word of God reaches human hearts, it's like seed being broadcast onto the ground. Does the seed get snatched away by Satan? Does the seed land in a thistle patch, where it is choked out by all the competing messages? Does the seed land on good earth, where it grows and produces an abundant crop? What kind of soil are you?

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THE -GESIMA SUNDAYS: SEPTUAGESIMA, SEXAGESIMA, QUINQUAGESIMA. These unusual names for Sundays are passed down to us from the abureh calendar of the Middle Accor. They are Letin names for the

from the church calendar of the Middle Ages. They are Latin names for the Sundays that fall between Transfiguration Sunday (last Sunday of Epiphany season) and the beginning of Lent. The words mean 70th, 60th, and 50th, respectively. The names are similar to our English words septuplets, sextuplets, and quintuplets. These Sundays fall approximately 70, 60, and 50 days before Easter. This year we celebrate only two of the three Gesima Sundays—Sexagesima and Quinquagesima. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 2.
