HOLY WEEK

The events which we remember and ponder this special week serve as the foundation blocks of our Christian faith and life.

- 2) The punishment of eternal death (hell) for sin no longer looms over us.
We are forgiven and we are free!
- 3) He will also raise us up physically at the end of time and take us to be with Him in the glories of heaven!

In Christ we live, now and forever. Christ is our crucified and risen Savior!

THE SECOND ARTICLE OF THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead and buried. He descended into hell. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN? (*Martin Luther, 1529*)

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord;

Who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death;

That I may be His own, and live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness; even as He is risen from the dead, lives, and reigns to all eternity.

This is most certainly true.
