**EPISTLE:** Galatians 3:15-22 God had promised Abraham that through Abraham's Seed all people on earth would be blessed. Abraham believed this promise—the promise of the Savior of all the world! Years later, God gave Abraham's descendants, the Israelites, His Law and His Commandments at Mt. Sinai taking them as His people. The Law and the Commandments did not replace the promise of the Savior-to-come, or provide an alternate way to get to heaven. The Law of God hedges-in sinners, showing them that they are guilty and in *need* of a Savior. Christ is that Savior!

GOSPEL Luke 10:25-37 A certain Pharisee, who was self-righteous and an expert in the requirements of Old Testament Law, asked Jesus how to get to heaven. The man well knew the Old Testament command to love the Lord totally and to love one's neighbor as oneself. What he did not see was that he had not done these things! Jesus told him the parable of the Good Samaritan, in which a non-Jew helped a sorely beaten Jew. Jesus wanted the Pharisee to see that if he thought he loved God and his neighbor sufficiently to get to heaven, then he needed to love Samaritans as well! ----- Could the man see that he needed a Savior?
