EPISTLE: Philippians 1:3-11. Paul was in prison for preaching Christ. There he found great joy in considering how the believers at Philippi were his partners in preaching the Gospel! He prayed that their love for Christ would grow, and that they would be found "blameless" when Christ returns. Such is every pastor's prayer!

Psalm 66, p.37 "Make a Joyful Shout to God!"

GOSPEL: Matthew 18:21-35

How can it be that we, who have been forgiven so much by our God, are not always ready to forgive those who sin against us? In Jesus' parable of The Unforgiving Servant, the debts of two debtors are compared. The first owed 10,000 talents of silver (the talent was a measure of silver by weight.) One talent was enough to make about 6,000 denarius coins. The second man owed one hundred denarius coins (one denarius was worth a day's wage). To compare the two amounts is striking. Assume a stack of one hundred denarius coins stands **ten inches** high. If so, then 10,000 of denarius coins—get this—would stand **ninety-four miles** high! Dumbfounding!

The big stack is the debt of sin we owe to God. God forgives for Jesus' sake. The little stack is the debt of sin another owes to us, which we struggle to forgive. Get the point? In our hearts, the sinful, proud, arrogant Old Adam, the inborn sinful nature in us, fights against forgiving others. The New Man of faith in Christ our Savior willingly forgives those who sin against us.

NOVEMBER 10, LUTHER'S BIRTH and A WORLD OF CHANGE:

On November 10, 1483, Martin Luther was born to Hans and Margareta Luther in Eisleben, Saxony, Germany. He was baptized on November 11 at St. Peter and Paul Church. He was named "Martin" in honor of St. Martin's Day, November 11.

Looking at the world view: In about 1450 Johannes Gutenberg developed movable type for printing presses, which meant easy and quick printing. Christopher Columbus was already alive. He would "discover America" in 1492. Ferdinand Magellan was born about the same time as Luther. He would lead a sailing expedition around the world, taking three years from 1519 to 1522. (Of his five ships, only one returned. Magellan himself was killed in the Philippines.)

Martin Luther lived and labored during a time of great change in the world! The Lord used Martin Luther to bring an even greater and more precious change—a return in the church to the preaching of forgiveness of sins and eternal life through faith in Christ alone, our crucified and risen Savior, Son of God and Son of Man.

Indeed, we thank the Lord for His direction of all human events for the sake of the preaching of the Gospel to souls everywhere. We are confident He continues to hold world events in His hand today.
