## SEPTUAGESIMA, SEXAGESIMA, QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAYS:

These unusual names are passed down to us from the church of the Middle Ages. They are Latin names for the Sundays that fall between Transfiguration Sunday (end of Epiphany season) and Ash Wednesday. The words mean 70th, 60th, and 50th, respectively. These Sundays fall approximately 70, 60, and 50 days before Easter . The names are similar to our English words septuplets, sextuplets, and quintuplets. This year we celebrate all three of the Gesima Sundays. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14

**LENT:** Lent is the forty day season preceding Easter during which we specially consider the depth of our Savior's suffering and His great love for us by which He freed us from our sins and their condemnation. It is a season in which we turn to Scripture to view these Truths, to be led to love Him more, to serve Him from the sincerity of our hearts, and to keep His commandments with a free and willing spirit. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on the day before Easter. The season lasts 40 days. The Sundays of Lent are excluded from the count (total count 46 days). "Lent" does not correspond to any particular "events" in Christ's life, unlike Good Friday and Easter. Its observance is purely Christian custom, reminiscent of Jesus' 40 days of temptation by the devil and Israel's 40 years of wandering in the wilderness. Congregations often have Wednesday evening services during Lent. Please join us on Wednesdays at 5:30 pm. The crucified and risen Savior's blessings!
