WEDNESDAY LENTEN SERVICES: Please note, this year we are holding midweek services at 5:30 pm, rather than 7:00. Soup/sandwich will follow the service instead of precede. The 5:30 time allows for a little earlier return home, particularly if one foregoes the meal. We hoped that this will serve members better.

LENT: Lent is the forty day season preceding Easter during which we specially consider the depth of our Savior's suffering and His great love for us by which He freed us from our sins and their condemnation. It is a season in which we turn to Scripture to view these Truths, to be led to love Him more, to serve Him from the sincerity of our hearts, and to keep His commandments with a free and willing spirit. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on the day before Easter. The season lasts 40 days. The Sundays of Lent are excluded from the count (total count 46 days). "Lent" does not correspond to any particular "events" in Christ's life, unlike Good Friday and Easter. Its observance is purely Christian custom, reminiscent of Jesus' 40 days of temptation by the devil and Israel's 40 years of wandering in the wilderness. Wednesday evening services are often held during Lent. Please join us on Wednesdays at 5:30 pm. The crucified and risen Savior's blessings!
