CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION OF SINS:

P: Also He spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves

EPISTLE: Romans 11:33-36 Paul marveled at the ways and wisdom of the Lord! In particular he was considering how the rejection of Christ by the Jews opened the door of faith to the Gentiles! The Gentiles in turn reached back to the Jews to bring them to Christ! A marvel! Today on Trinity Sunday, we similarly marvel at another unfathomable mystery, that God is three yet one! His essence, His ways, and His wisdom are beyond us!

GOSPEL Matthew 3:13-17 At the baptism of Jesus the three persons of the Triune God are in evidence. God the Son was baptized at the Jordan River for our sins. God the Holy Spirit descended from heaven upon Him, in appearance like a dove to be His counselor and aide. God the Father spoke from heaven words of divine approval. There are three distinct "persons." Yet, as stated in the Old Testament, one divine "being": "Hear, O Israel, the LORD, our God, the LORD, is one" (Deuteronomy 6:4). His interest and glory is your salvation!

THE ATHANASIAN CREED: Hymnal, page 53

Note: 1. "catholic" with small "c" rightfully means "universal, Christian"

- 2."he, therefore, that will be saved must thus think of the Trinity"
 This Creed is a statement of the teaching of the Bible.
 Explaining the Trinity so as to satisfy human logic is error.
 Trusting sinful human reason damns.
 - 3. "and they that have done good shall go into life everlasting"

 Doing good because one has been given heaven in Christ is right

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THE ATHANASIAN CREED:

The three creeds or statements of belief of the early Christian Church were The Apostles' Creed, The Nicene Creed, and The Athanasian Creed. Christian churches still confess and hold to these three creeds today. Of the three, the Athanasian Creed is the longest and the least used. It is often read on Trinity Sunday.

The Athanasian Creed expounds the Scriptural teaching of the Trinity:

1) The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are <u>each distinctly different</u>, not just three names for the same identity.

2) The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit <u>each are fully God</u>, not just 1/3 God.

3) Yet the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are <u>only one Being</u>—one God—not three gods! These truths are illogical and beyond our understanding, a mystery, which we accept by faith.

The Athanasian Creed also declares a second Scriptural teaching which is beyond our understanding—that our Lord Jesus Christ is the God-man, true God and true man in one person. He is not divided into two personalities—the God Jesus and the man Jesus. He is not, by some sort of mixture, half-God and half-man He is <u>fully God and fully man in one person</u>. He lived without sin (God), died for our sin (man), and rose for our salvation (God)! This also is a mystery we accept by faith.

"TRINITY" AND "TRIUNE": Although the words "trinity" and "triune" are not found in the Bible; they are words that well express what the Bible teaches about God. He is three, yet one. Tri – une.

WHO WAS ATHANASIUS? Athanasius was one of the early church fathers who lived during the 300's AD. In the early church there was disagreement and misunderstanding regarding the essence of God. At the general church council held in 381 AD at Constantinople (Istanbul today), Athanasius led the way in bringing theologians and delegates to a correct Biblical understanding of the Godhead and the Trinity. The Athanasian Creed was written about two hundred years later and named in his honor.
