SERVE THE LORD FROM THE HEART, FOR THE GOSPEL!

This text will not be read prior to the sermon, but in paragraphs as the sermon proceeds.

⁶We have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by; so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter.

⁷ What shall we say then? Is the law sin? Certainly not! On the contrary, I would not have known sin except through the law. For I would not have known covetousness unless the law had said, "You shall not covet."

⁸ But sin, taking opportunity by the commandment, produced in me all manner of evil desire. . . . ¹³ so that sin, through the commandment, might become exceedingly sinful. . . .

¹⁸ I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find. ¹⁹ For the good that I will to do, I do not do; but the evil I will not to do, that I practice.

²⁰ Now if I do what I will not to do, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. . . .
