THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

Ponder where you would be without the comfort of Jesus' atonement for your sin, and without the assurance of your acquittal. On the edge of despair! You could deceive yourself into thinking that God's standards are as low as your standards and that you have sufficiently pleased Him. You could deceive yourself into thinking that hell can't be that bad. You could deceive yourself into thinking that God doesn't exist; therefore, when you are dead you're done—no problem. But what about the haunting thoughts and fears of God's retribution? About facing God? Christ is your comfort! He comes to you personally in this Supper. "Receive the very life I gave for you. Peace be with you."

GOSPEL Luke 10:1-12 Jesus sent out seventy disciples. He reminded them that the harvest is great, that "wolves" would be lying in wait, that those to whom they would go would provide their sustenance. Jesus instructed them to heal the sick and preach the Kingdom of God! The cities that would not receive them should be warned of God's judgment. ----- Preachers are God's messengers.

SERMON: LUKE 5:1-11 “LABORING FOR THE LORD”

¹ So it was, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, ² and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing their nets. Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. ⁴ When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵ But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless, at Your word I will let down the net."

⁶ And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. ⁷ So they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸ When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord! ⁹ For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men." ¹¹ So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.
