THE ADVENT WREATH: The Advent Wreath is often used in preparation for Christmas. It is a Christian custom (not Biblical) whose origins appear to be in Lutheran circles in Germany during the 1800’s. One candle was lit each day to point children ahead to the great day of Christmas. Many modifications have been made over the years. Currently we light one candle each week during Advent. We also light a Christmas candle. Various meanings and points of devotion are suggested for the candles.

THE SECOND ADVENT CANDLE: The following points have been suggested: Name--The Bethlehem Candle. Color--VIOLET, the color of repentance. Thoughts—The eternal Son of God humbly came to this earth to be born of a woman at Bethlehem. He came, both true God and true man, our Savior!
